from eleanor roosevelt to you

The first Altrusa club was formed in 1917. It was a time when World War I patriotism was running high and the name 'Altrusa' was a coined combination of 'altruism' and 'USA.' Though originally conceived as a first-of-its-kind social club for businesswomen, its charter members quickly identified service to others as a key aim of the organization.

Over the course of our long history, Altrusa has attracted dynamic leaders from fascinating business backgrounds. Eleanor Roosevelt was an enthusiastic member of Altrusa in New York City and helped form a club in Albany by inviting prospects to the executive mansion when Franklin served as governor. Union leaders and novelists, educators and surgeons, a curator of Egyptology, a manager of an extensive sheep raising operation — all have found in Altrusa a home for their talents and interests.
